Week 7 – Firework Listening Activities

Firework was written by Katy Perry as an inspirational anthem with the theme of selfempowerment. It featured on her 2010 album, Teenage Dream, and was released by Capitol Records. Listen to the original version of the song and answer these questions:

- 1. What genre do you think the style of the song is?
- 2. The song starts with the famous question 'Do you ever feel like a plastic bag?' Look at the lyrics of Verse 1. What do you think the verse is actually asking you?
- 3. The mood changes throughout the song. Take a look at the lyrics of the verse, prechorus and chorus. Think of what they are saying in each section. How does the music match the mood in each section?
- 4. The song is called *Firework*. Listen to the pre-chorus (*You just gotta ignite...*). How does the music and instrumentation build up the suspense, leading into the chorus? How could this be similar to watching a firework?
- 5. The musical term *texture* describes the layers in music. Listen to the instruments in this song. Do any of them feature as a solo line or do they mostly play together?
- 6. Firework has featured in the soundtrack of a number of films and television programmes. Why do you think it is often chosen?
- 7. Do you like the song? Why?

Firework – Did you know?

Did you know that **similes** and **metaphors** are used in creative writing and poetry to compare things. **Similes** use the words 'like' or 'as' to describe something as being like something else. **Metaphors** describe something as actually being something else. Songwriters often use **metaphors** and **similes** in their lyrics to help paint a picture in your mind. Justin Timberlake uses the **metaphor:** 'I got that sunshine in my pocket…', whilst Shawn Mendes uses the **simile** 'Just like a moth drawn to a flame…'.

Can you find any metaphors and similes in Firework?
