<u>Week 11 – Here Comes The Sun</u> <u>Listening Activities</u>

Here Comes The Sun was written by **George Harrison**. It was featured on the 1969 album **Abbey Road** which was recorded by the famous rock band **The Beatles**. George Harrison was the lead guitarist in The Beatles and he both sings and plays guitar in the song. Listen to the original version of *Here Comes The Sun* and answer these questions:

- 1. What genre do you think the song belongs to?
- 2. The title and lyrics use the phrase '*Here comes the sun*'. Although George was inspired by the weather, the phrase also has another meaning? What do you think this could be?
- 3. Read the lyrics of the song. Can you see a pattern in the way they are written? How do you think this influences the mood of the song?
- 4. The introduction features the *Acoustic Guitar* which has a more natural sound. Compare this to the *Electric Guitar* in the intro of last week's song *Heroes (We Could Be).* Can you hear the difference?
- 5. The Beatles are one of the most influential bands in popular music history. Can you think of any other famous songs by The Beatles?
- 6. Can you identify the structure of the song using the terms: Intro, Verse, Chorus, Bridge and Outro?
- 7. During the **Bridge** section of the song, the time signature keeps changing. This means the amount of beats in the bar changes. Listen out, just before George sings *'Sun, Sun, Here it comes'* Can you hear it?
- 8. Do you like the song Here Comes The Sun? Can you describe why?

Here Comes The Sun – Did you know?

Although **The Beatles** are often called a **Rock** band, their music covered many different styles. *Here Comes The Sun* can be described as *Folk Pop* in its style. This is due to the use of the **Acoustic Guitar** and also the **ornamentation** in the melody line. **Ornamentation** is a decoration in the music. It is often simple and involves the musician using the pitches above or below a note, to make the note sound interesting. You can hear this on the words *Winter* (*verse 1*), *Say* (*chorus*) and *Comes* (*last word in the bridge*). Listen to some traditional folk music and see if you can spot this technique.
