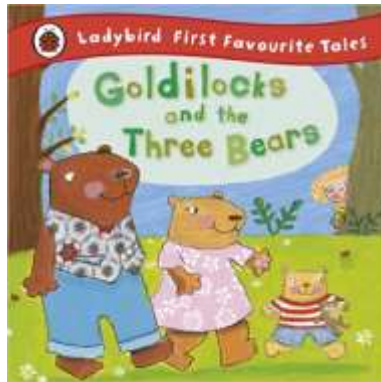

## Goldilocks and the Three Bears

**PITCH** in music is the **HIGH** and **LOW** notes!

Great big Daddy Bear is the biggest bear and he has the deepest, **lowest-pitched** voice:

Can you chant or say 'Great big Daddy Bear, Great big Daddy Bear' in your deepest, lowest voice?

Can you tap your knees at the same time? (to represent low pitch)



Middle sized Mummy Bear is the medium-sized bear and she has a **middle-pitched** voice:

Can you chant or say 'Middle-sized Mummy Bear, Middle-sized Mummy Bear' in your medium, middle-pitched voice?

Can you tap your chest at the same time? (to represent middle pitch)



Little tiny Baby Bear is the smallest bear and he has a **high-pitched** voice:

Can you chant or say 'Little tiny Baby Bear, Little tiny Baby Bear' in your highest, squeakiest voice?

Can you tap your head at the same time? (to represent high pitch)



**TIPS FOR GROWN UPS!**

As you read the story to your little ones, you can change the pitch of your voice to represent each bear as they are speaking.

For example: 'Who's been eating my porridge?', 'Who's been sitting in my chair?' and 'Who's been sleeping in my bed?' Etc.

Use a **LOW VOICE** for DADDY BEAR. Use a **MIDDLE VOICE** for MUMMY BEAR.  
Use a **HIGH VOICE** for BABY BEAR.
